## Camp Log

The pre-camp meeting was held on May 12<sup>th</sup>(Thursday) at HQ when all gear was assembled and camp fees collected.

On Friday May 13<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm the Troop met at HQ and gear was loaded onto the trailer provided by Major Howard. In three journeys he conveyed all kit to the site. At 7:30pm those attending marched from HQ to the site (in uniform with staves at trail double file). The site was laid out (as diagram) & after inspection at 9:30pm, beds were made & instructions given to new campers.

At 10:30 the entire camp personnel visited the school swimming pool for a moonlight swim which was enjoyed by all.

From the time at start of camp the weather has been good with much sunshine. After the swim & a supper of bread, cheese & biscuits, lights out was at 11:15pm

The first patrol (Owls) awakened at 4:30am & the entire camp was roused by 6am. All Scouts had a swim at 6:30am & it promises another fine day. Skip left for work and we had sausages and fried bread for breakfast. After breakfast we tidied up the camp site. We had a good dinner of stewed beef, potatoes. Cooky had to go to Holt and get several drinks. Skip came back at 2 o'clock and we all went down to the swimming pool for the afternoon. Skip enjoyed himself with two young ladies, we came back from the swimming pool about 6 pm, had bread & butter and from then we prepared for the camp fire. Mrs marsh and another scout master and his young lady <sup>(visited)</sup> after the camp fire we had supper and went to bed.

Sunday 15.8.'54. we got up at 8:30am; we had sausages, bacon and fried bread. After we had breakfast we went down to the swimming pool. We came back about 2:30pm. we didn't have much dinner only biscuits and cake. At 3pm the Rector and Major Howard and his wife and children came for a Scout's Own. After the service, the Cubs came and we played football. We had chops, fried potatoes, cheese and cake for tea. After tea we went for a swim; we came back about 6:30pm. At about 9. O'clock we had supper and went to bed.

Monday 16.8.54 – Got up at 7:30 had cornflakes & chops for breakfast. Skip went to work at 7:45. We went exploring and plate bashing. I lost my plate. We ate up all the fruit and cake for dinner. After dinner we washed up and began to take the tents down. It thundered but no rain yet. It began to rain at 3:30pm. we got everything on the trailer. We played about till Major Howard came and then we went home.

### Glandford



#### Saturday 24<sup>th</sup>

We left H.Q. at 3pm. we started off with a cracked trek-cart, so we had to have tent poles to support. When going down Letheringsett Hill a lorry from Leicester passed us with Girl Guides in, everybody turned round, so the cart went careering off into the hedge. When recovered we saw a lorry from Cambridge full of Scouts. We turned the corner to Letheringsett Lake and stopped for a rest. A long stretch up to Bayfield Brecks was done with a strain (the stave broke).

When we arrived at Glandford at 5pm, we pitched camp with six ridge tents and one bell tent. Some of the boys changed into their swimming trunks and went in for a swim. The others chopped branches from a dead tree. Tea was made and we had bread and jam or marmalade and biscuits. After tea everybody went walking down the river to an old weeping willow tree. Some returned early and were getting the fire ready, when the others returned we had supper of popcorn and cocoa. Then everybody went to bed tired.

Sunday 25<sup>th</sup>

Roger Cooke and Clive Cooper were first up at 5pm. it was raining badly for a while. Afterwards they lit a fire after a little trouble. The others soon began to rise and were quickly doing jobs, fetching milk etc. Soon we had breakfast of cornflakes, bacon and egg omelette. Then everybody went to wash their plates in the river. After breakfast it was a washout, the rain was pelting down. It eased a bit and the S.M, ASM, TL and a PL went to the Bluebell at Wiveton for drinks.

The others stayed behind and cooked dinner on a primus stove in a horse shed. Everybody enjoyed a dinner of potatoes, sausages, beans and peas. Still raining. It was decided it would be better to go home early in Woodrow's lorry. So after dinner Rikki and Titch went with Mrs Steadman to Holt to fetch the lorry. While waiting, R. Cooke tied a piece of rope to a billy-can and threw it in the river and caught small eels. We arrived home in the rain about 3:30pm.
